

Delegation from the Anglican Communion will attend the funeral of Pope Francis in Rome Armagh

A delegation from the Anglican Communion will attend the funeral of Pope Francis in Rome on Saturday April 26, representing the prayers and condolences of Anglicans around the world.

They will join with other Anglican leaders and pilgrims, and many other representatives from Christian World Communions, travelling to Rome in mourning for the Holy Father.

The Anglican delegation consists of senior clergy and lay leaders of the Anglican Communion and those who lead the fruitful ecumenical work between Anglicans and Roman Catholics at the international level. The co-chairs of the Anglican-Roman Catholic International Commission (ARCIC) and the International Anglican-Roman Catholic Commission for Unity and Mission (IARCCUM) will both be present.

The delegation will be led by the Most Revd Marinez Bassotto, the Archbishop of the Igreja Episcopal Anglicana do Brasil.

She serves on the Standing Committee of the Anglican Communion as the regional Primate for the Americas. The five-person Primates' Standing Committee helps to support the Anglican Communion pastorally and to represent the Communion ecumenically.

Anglicans who minister locally in Italy will also be present, including the pastors of the two Anglican parishes in Rome.

Speaking about the funeral, the Rt Revd Anthony Ball, Director of the Anglican Centre in Rome, said:

"Anglicans give thanks for the life and ministry of Pope Francis. He was an example to Christians worldwide, unwavering in his dedication to the plight of the poor, the vulnerable and refugees. We are grateful for his work in building relations between Anglicans and Roman Catholics, as part of his deep commitment to working for the unity of God's Church. On behalf of Anglicans around the world, we offer condolences to our sisters and brothers in the Catholic Church."

The Most Revd Marinez Bassotto, Primate of the Igreja Episcopal Anglicana do Brasil, said:

"It is an honour to give thanks for the amazing life and ministry of Pope Francis, who was the first Latin American Pope. He was a humble servant who embodied a message of peace and love. His example calls Christians to walk together in unity and to serve the poor and marginalised. At his funeral, we bring with us the prayers and tributes of Anglicans across the globe."

The Most Revd and Rt Hon Stephen Cottrell, the Archbishop of York said:

"Pope Francis was a great Pope — but above all, he was a faithful follower of Jesus Christ. 'Blessed are the meek,' said our Lord, 'for they shall inherit the earth.' In many ways, Pope Francis lived this truth. His humility and compassion touched hearts around the world. His example calls us all to care more deeply for the poor, the excluded, and the vulnerable. The world mourns his passing and gives thanks for his life. May he rest in peace and rise in glory."

National Scout Organizations across the world share remembrance and gratitude for Pope Francis

Scouts around the world are paying tribute to Pope Francis, who passed away earlier this week aged 88, reflecting on his life and lasting legacy.

A powerful advocate for young people, he frequently spoke of their potential and hopes for the future, striking parallels with Scouting's values through messages focused on themes of friendship, faith, and action.



Born in the Argentine capital of Buenos Aires, Pope Francis made history as the first pontiff from Latin America. Throughout his papacy, he championed social justice and was a leading voice in addressing the climate crisis. He played a pivotal role in fostering inter-religious dialogue,

working tirelessly to bring different faiths closer together in the spirit of peace and mutual understanding. His humility and dedication to serving others resonated with Scouting communities worldwide.

As a spiritual leader, he visited Scout groups across the globe, inspiring many to make a difference and build a more just and peaceful society. In an interview in 2015, he urged Scouts to embrace stewardship, saying: "Remember, we are just custodians, we are here for a very short period of time on Earth. So when you work with Scouts, make sure we pass along a good Earth and a good world and all the good values that are important."

In the days since his passing, Scouting organisations in countries including Chile, Paraguay, Poland, Spain, Timor-Leste, and the United Kingdom have joined in honouring his memory. **The International Catholic Conference of Scouting**, an international body representing roughly 8 million Scouts, paid tribute to Pope Francis for carrying the "dreams of the young people" and "those values which are dear to the Scouts".

Scouting Ireland said it is deeply saddened by the passing of His Holiness Pope Francis. "Throughout his papacy, Pope Francis shared a deep and genuine care for young people, often encouraging Scouts to be "builders of a better world" and to live lives of service, courage, and hope. His messages reminded us of the power of youth to shape a more just and compassionate society.

"We give thanks for his inspiring leadership and keep him, and all who mourn his loss, in our thoughts and prayers".




