A 9.1-magnitude earthquake off Indonesia's western tip on 26 December 2004 generated a series of waves as high as 30 metres that pummelled the coastline of 14 countries from Indonesia to Somalia.

Life-saving skills of specialist dogs from Northern Ireland will be offered around the world through a new partnership with a major airline.

Belfast Telegraph - Search And Rescue Dog Association Ireland North (SARDA IN) is a key first responder to major disasters at home and abroad.

The organisation was set up by Co Cork man Neil Powell in 1978.

Neil, who moved to Newcastle, Co Down, with his wife many years ago was part of the Mourne Mountain Rescue Team but wanted to train dogs to help during searches too, and so SARDA IN began with its first canine helper — a German Shepherd called Kim.

Neil and SARDA IN have helped deal with global tragedies through the years, including the Lockerbie disaster of 1988, when a passenger plane exploded over the Scottish town.

Margaret Peacock has spent the last 40 Christmases serving up a huge community meal for people who would otherwise spend the day isolated.

"People want to be with their families at Christmas and they don't think about people who are alone," she told BBC News NI.

The Coleraine pensioner tries to provide "a good hot dinner, entertainment and a present for everyone" on 25 December.

Some of the food is donated by local businesses but aside from a small annual subscription, gifts are paid for by Margaret, her family and friends.
