

"There's still time to visit our stand at the Balmoral Show and to sample the delicious Guatemalan coffee and chocolate on offer".




We were delighted to welcome Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs Minister Andrew Muir to our stand.

Presbyterians meet women living in war zones as part of conference

Members of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland have returned from Lebanon after taking part in a special

conference of Christian women who continue to be impacted by war and conflict.

Rev Dr Liz Hughes, the former convener of the church's council for global mission, and Heather Clements, convenor of the council's global mission committee, took part in 'The unheard voice: women's persevering witness in war' conference, which brought together women from Lebanon, Syria and Transcarpathia in western Ukraine, along with Hungarian speaking reformed communities in central Europe.

Mrs Clements said: "Of the 24 participants who attended, some were pastors, or pastor's wives, and others were women who were in leadership in their congregations. "We heard of the impact of the Russian invasion of Ukraine and the ongoing war, for others it was coping with Israeli airstrikes in southern Lebanon, or surviving Isis death squads."

Rev Dr Liz Hughes said: "Each of the women felt deep sadness for what conflict had done to their countries, family and church families.

"It was an incredible privilege to see just a glimpse of what God sees: the silent, resilient and courageous persevering strength that you often find in women hidden in the pages of the Bible." Courtesy Belfast Telegraph.

with those places that suffer most grievously, like Ukraine and the Holy Land."

St Patrick's distributes Community and Charitable Funds

Saint Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin, announcedd the recipients of the most recent round of distribution of the Community and Charitable Fund.

At a time when the world is very bleak in terms of news of war, struggle, and brokenness, reading through and investigating each of the applications was a very heartening process. Each organisation demonstrates compassion, care for others, connectivity, Christian faith in action.

"The total fund to be distributed amounts to €145,292.59. The applications for support exceeded €600,000 which made our decision process excruciatingly difficult. Within our



application form we requested other ways of engagement that we could support applicants with their good works. In the coming months and year, we will be engaging with the organisations who have not been successful in accessing funds in this round, to explore the opportunities that they have identified and put some plans in place to extend other forms of support".

2025 Prayer Movement – Grants available for Parish Prayer Activities in Dublin & Glendalough

Parishes in Dublin & Glendalough are being encouraged to engage creatively with the 2025 Prayer Movement.

The Mission Sub Committee of Diocesan Councils is offering small grants towards parish activities which aim to get people involved in the movement.

The committee's vision is to see all parishes in our United Dioceses flourish as communities of faith, confident in sharing the Good News we have been given and serving our society. They invite everyone to join the 2025 Prayer Movement as we pray that God will guide us in our work.

There are lots of ways in which parishes can engage with this initiative. You might consider a prayer breakfast, or a prayer night in the church. Your youth group might have a pizza prayer party, or the Sunday School could do prayer craft activities. The possibilities are endless.

To support these activities the Mission Sub Committee is offering groups small grant awards of up to €250 towards a project you might have that gets people in your local church praying for growth in our diocese.

Please give a description of the prayer activity and how many people are going to be involved. The number of grants the committee can award is limited, so do apply early.



Iran-born refugee could be first female to be appointed Archbishop of Canterbury - Daily Telegraph

Iran-born refugee who criticised Starmer over migrants speech would be first female in top job, Albert Tait writes.

The Rt Rev Guli Francis-Dehqani, the Bishop of Chelmsford, has emerged as an early frontrunner among bookmakers to succeed Justin Welby, who formally stepped down in January.

Ladbrokes and Star Sports have both named her as favourite to become the 106th holder of the role and the first woman in the job's 1,428-year history.

Dr Francis-Dehqani has been an outspoken critic of the immigration policy of successive governments.

Earlier this week, she criticised the Prime Minister's speech in which he said Britain risked "becoming an island of strangers". She said: "In the churches and different communities I am a part of, we are not an 'island of strangers'. Migrants are not 'strangers' but friends who fully participate and contribute as we worship, serve and live life together.

"The vast majority have applied through official routes to come here to the UK to live, work and study and their contributions go far beyond a simple binary GDP evaluation."

She also criticised the previous government's Rwanda asylum plan and attacked Suella Braverman, the former home secretary, after she said that churches fuelled fake asylum claims.

Dr Francis-Dehqani's family fled to Britain when she was just 13 following Iran's Islamic Revolution in the late 1970s. Her brother was shot dead in 1980 and attempts were made on the lives of her father, an Anglican Bishop, and mother before they left.

She was ordained in 1999 and served as Bishop of Loughborough from 2017 to 2021 before moving to Chelmsford in 2021. She is now one of five women among the bookmakers' frontrunners to become the most senior bishop and the spiritual leader of the Church.

This month, the Church announced the central members and Anglican Communion representatives of the Canterbury Crown Nominations Commission, the body charged with nominating the new archbishop. Its membership was expected to be known in March, but there appear to have been delays in the selection of representatives from the diocese of Canterbury.

On Tuesday, the Church confirmed Stephen Cottrell, Archbishop of York – currently the most senior bishop in the Church – would be among the voting members, alongside Graham Usher, the Bishop of Norwich. It had already been confirmed the commission would be chaired by Lord Evans of Weardale, former director-general of MI5.

Candidates have to be at least 30 years old, and are generally younger than 70. A nomination cannot be made unless it has the support of two-thirds of the total number of CNC voting members in a secret ballot.

The commission is expected to have its first meeting later this month. At least two further meetings will follow in July and September.

It is expected there could be an announcement on a nomination for the 106th archbishop by autumn.

The Church has faced calls to speed up the process of appointing Mr Welby's successor. Conservative MP Martin Vickers said it had a lot to learn from the Catholic Church's speedy election of the new Pope.
