

### Down & Connor Word on Fire Evangelisation Networking Event

This week for an afternoon parish and diocesan leaders gathered at St Comgall's centre for a networking event hosted by Word on Fire in collaboration with the diocesan Pathways to the Future Team.

The focus was on renewed opportunities for evangelisation in todays culture. Together, we reflected on how to share the message of Christ while navigating the many cultural challenges we face.



The day began with words of welcome and an opening prayer from Bishop Alan McGuckian SJ, setting a prayerful





tone for discussions. Fr. Billy Swan from the Diocese of Ferns, who regularly writes for Word on Fire, was the event MC in his thought provoking talk on the principles of evangelisation reminded us that these must always be rooted in the person of Christ.

Professor Gladys Ganiel, Professor at Queens University Belfast in the Sociology of Religion, shared recent statistics and trends in religious practice in Ireland helping us to understand our current context more deeply. Brendan Thompson, Word on Fire's UK Programme Director, further inspired us with practical insights on supporting lay Catholics in bringing Christ into the world and shared some exciting events coming up by Word on Fire in the new year.

At the heart of the event was the message that evangelisation must be Christ-centred, grounded in genuine

encounters . Thank were conveyed to Emily Nelson from FaithVersed and members of the Pathways to The Future team who organised the event, to Fr Brian Watters for the photography and especially to everyone who joined the event! 


### **Kildare's tour of St Patrick's**

## AMRI announces new president, vice president and executive council

On 31 October, the Association of Leaders of Missionaries and Religious of Ireland (AMRI)



announced its new Executive Council. Father Joe McGee MSC has been elected President, and Sister Barbara Murphy IBVM will serve as Vice-President (pictured above).

AMRI represents and promotes active collaboration between Religious Institutes, Societies of Apostolic Life and Lay Missionary Organisations. It seeks to respond to existing and emerging realities both in Ireland and overseas by supporting and energising the life and ministries of its members and of the wider Church with a renewed sense of hope and relevance.

Father McGee and Sister Murphy both paid tribute to the outgoing Executive Council under the leadership of Father Tim Lehane SVD and Sister Mary Hanrahan PBVM.

Father McGee, a Donegal native, was elected for the second time as Provincial of the Missionaries of the Sacred Heart in 2023. He was professed in 1985 and ordained in 1986.

Father McGee has exercised his pastoral ministry mostly in England serving as parish priest and school chaplain. He also served his community as formator for several years. He is well known as a member of the Team of the RFMP course in Loreto House where he spent five years, an experience he appreciates very much.

Welcoming his appointment, Father McGee said, "I look forward to working closely with AMRI and with the support of the Executive Council I will endeavour to serve the wider membership to the best of my ability."

Sister Murphy, who hails from Wexford, is Provincial of Loreto Sisters in Ireland and made her first profession in 1977. Sister Murphy served in a number of ministries and leadership positions.

The other members of the new Executive Council are: Sister Breege O'Neill RSM, Father Brendan O'Rourke CSsR, Sister Irene Balzan MMM, Sister Anozie Ndidi Eucharia MSHR, Father Jim Noonan OCD, Father Michael O'Sullivan Mafr, and, Denise Flack of Viatores Christi.

### **Cletus Noone OFM, RIP**

### On 6th November 2024 Fr Cetus Noone OFM died peacefully in Carrigoran Nursing Home, Co. Clare. He was just short of his 92nd birthday.

Francis Noone was born in November 1932 in Woodquay, Galway city, where he was an altar boy in the nearby Franciscan church, "The Abbey".

He joined the Friars Minor in 1951 when he went to the novitiate in Killarney where he received his religous name, Cletus. He celebrated his First Profession the following year, and after studies in Galway and Rome he was ordained to the priesthood in 1959.

Over his long years of priestly ministry, Cletus served in our friaries in Killarney, where he was appointed Guardian, and in Limerick and Ennis, where he spent the last decades of his life.

His warm, jovial personality warmed him to the people, and he was a popular preacher. His weekly homilies at the St Anthony Novena always began with the telling of a few jokes.

For years Cletus hosted a well-liked weekly Saturday night programme on Clare FM, "Noone at Night". The hour included songs, listeners requests, reflections and occasional interviews.

### **Toome Canal Walking Tour**

Date: Monday, 11th November

This marks the 10th Toome Canal tour in recent weeks, with 44 attendees to date. As a highlights tour of local history, it will cover the story of Matthew Leonard, a Toomebridge native who sailed on the Titanic, as well as John Carey and the Toome Temple of Liberty, Lisnacloskey House, and the Grant Brothers, founders of the local diatomite industry. Participants are encouraged to bring questions as the tour traces Toome's history from 9000 BC to today. Cost: £5 per person

The promotional image for the tour features the **Carey Monument at Duneane Presbyterian Churchyard**. The tours will delve into the history of the Carey family and their philanthropic contributions to Toome, including the donation of a water fountain and the Temple of Liberty to the village.
