## **Charles Wood Summer School and** Festival go hybrid

The Charles Wood Festival and Summer School is back with a unique mix of live and digital events in Armagh's sacred spaces from Sunday 22nd to Sunday 29th August. The week will be packed with top-quality music, worship and performance.

The opening days of the Festival can be enjoyed via digital platforms, from song recitals to workshops and special features. Contributors include Patron John Rutter, vocal impresario Paul Farrington, and top Northern Irish performers Ruth McGinley and Carolyn Dobbin.

On Wednesday 25th the doors will open once again to live audiences with a Bach at Twilight organ recital in St. Malachy's Church. Matthew Owens, from Belfast Cathedral, will be at the console. Stars of the future appear in the Lunchtime Concert in the First Presbyterian Church on Saturday 28th – including violinist Julie Piggott, winner of the Northern Ireland Young Musician of the Year 2021. That same evening St. Patrick's Church of Ireland Cathedral will host a large-scale programme entitled 'Sing Unto the Lord', sure to uplift, comfort and inspire.

### **Organ recitals in Cork and Dublin**

### St Fin Barre's cathedral, Cork, is hosting a series of lunchtime organ recitals each Friday in August at 1.10pm.

This is the third year in which the cathedral has run such a series, and the second year in which it will be held under the strict health guidelines which churches are following. The capacity is limited to 50 people, seating is by social distancing, and masks are require. The first recital was given last Friday by Andrew Johnstone, Assistant Director of Music at St Bartholomew's church, Dublin, and next Friday Professor Gerard Gillen, Titular Organist Emeritus at St Mary's Pro–Cathedral, Dublin, will play music by Louis Vierne, Naji Hakim's Mariales and the Flor Peeters Toccata, Fugue and Hymn on 'Ave maris stella'. David Adams, one of Ireland leading organ tutors and Professor at the Royal Irish Academy of Music, will give the third recital on 20 August and Robbie Carroll, Assistant Director of Music at St Fin Barre's, will conclude the series on 27 August.

In St Patrick's cathedral, Dublin, recitals are continuing every Friday at 5.00 p.m. until the end of August. The cathedral organists, David Leigh and Stuart Nicholson, will be giving an organ recital online on the Willis organ. Further details at -

# Renfrewshire church awarded prestigious silver environmental award

A church in Renfrewshire has gained a prestigious environmental award which recognises efforts towards caring for creation.

Oakshaw Trinity Church in Paisley recently reached the silver level of the Eco-Congregation Scotland scheme after meeting green targets set by the organisation.

The award comes around three years after the church, which is made up of a building shared ecumenically by the Church of Scotland and the United Reformed Church, joined the Eco-Congregation network.

Fiona Catterson, who is a member of the Eco-Committee at the church, said: "We are so excited and pleased to receive

the silver award as it shows that we at Oakshaw Trinity are moving along the right pathway. The award is also helping steer our next step. We found the Eco-Congregation Scotland materials great to use and used the Environmental Audit as our starting point.

"When we actually looked at this and spoke to all the church groups who use our facilities we realised that we were already doing more than we first had thought so decided to concentrate our efforts on going for the silver award rather than bronze.

"Obviously, Covid changed how and what we have been doing over the last 16 months but it has also given us time to reflect."

Churches wishing to gain a silver award must meet a standard made up of 11 criteria, that cover everything from including care for creation in worship to looking at ways to make their building more environmentally friendly and considering the biodiversity of their area.

Eco-Congregation Scotland is a movement of Scottish church congregations, of all de-nominations and none, committed to addressing environmental issues through their life and mission.

A spokesperson for Eco-Congregation Scotland said: "The silver award which Oakshaw Trinity Church has achieved recognises that a congregation has met or exceeded Eco-Congregation's silver award standards in spiritual living, practical living and global living, while also addressing some more general aspects or environmental care.

"The assessors noted that the team at Oakshaw Trinity church had presented a strong application for their silver award.

"They were impressed by the way in which the team arranged their meetings to ensure that the Kirk Session is kept fully appraised of their work.

"The assessors also commended the discussion about environmental matters within the congregation."

### A quarter of pregnancies in England and Wales ended in abortion in 2019

### New figures released by the Office for National Statistics has revealed a quarter of pregnancies in England and Wales resulted in abortion in 2019.

More than 200,000 pregnancies out of 821,809 recorded by residents of England and Wales in 2019 were aborted.

The ONS said: "The percentage of conceptions leading to a legal abortion among all women in England and Wales increased from 24 per cent in 2018 to 25.2 per cent in 2019,

the second year in a row this has increased for all age groups".

Although the annual report on pregnancies recorded in 2020 has not been published yet, the abortion figure is expected to exceed that of 2019.

Pro-life campaigners argue that the rise is due to the temporary measures introduced by governments during national lockdowns, such as DIY home abortions.

In May, more than 600 medical professionals signed an open letter to governments in the four UK nations requesting 'at home' abortion schemes be revoked with immediate effect.

The letter followed public consultations by the government on whether to make the policy permanent and highlighted the risks it poses for women's health.

Although annual statistics on conceptions among residents in England and Wales are not yet available for 2020, the increased number of abortions recorded that year suggests that the percentage of pregnancies ending in abortion will likely exceed the 2019 figure.

Spokesperson for Right To Life UK, Catherine Robinson said: "It is a tragedy that over a quarter of all pregnancies in England and Wales ended due to abortion in 2019".

"Every one of these abortions represents a failure of our society to protect the lives of babies in the womb and a

failure to offer full support to women with unplanned pregnancies".

"This significant rise in abortions in 2020 will likely mean that this statistic will be even higher for 2020. This is especially worrying given that the introduction of the home abortion scheme has put so many women at risk of complications, and has facilitated a number of illegal abortions past the legal term limit for 'at home' abortions. We are therefore calling on the UK and Welsh Governments to end these 'DIY' home abortion schemes immediately".

# Prayers lift up peaceful elections in Zambia

During National Ecumenical Prayers for Peaceful Elections in Zambia, held on 1 August, religious and civic leaders gathered in-person and online to pray for peaceful elections in the nation, which has been coping with a rise in violence during the lead-up to 12 August voting.

The theme for the service, held at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Lusaka, was 'Blessed are the peacemakers.' The event was organized by the Coalition for Peaceful Elections in Zambia and the Christian Churches Monitoring Group.

The same day as the prayer service, Zambia deployed the military to curb the violence.

Religious leaders and organizations from across the world, including the Vatican and the United Nations, shared

messages of solidarity and good will.

Rev Dr Benjamin Simon, World Council of Churches (WCC) programme executive for church relations, delivered a pre-recorded video message on behalf of the WCC.



"Peace is more than just the absence of war and violence," said Simon. "So being a true peacemaker is certainly not an easy task."

The path to peace is often difficult and painful, Simon continued. "On behalf of the World Council of Churches, I do wish you all a blessed and peaceful election period," he said. "May the Holy Spirit guide you and lead you to become peacemakers in your country and in this world."

# Speaking to the Soul

Whatever happens, my dear brothers and sisters, rejoice in the Lord. I never get tired of telling you these things, and I do it to safeguard your faith. Watch out for those dogs, those people who do evil, those mutilators who say you must be circumcised to be saved. Philippians 3:1-2 NLT

There is something incredibly impressive about people who are joyful when everything is going wrong. Paul's list of problems was a long one. He had the indignity and discomfort of being in prison not knowing whether he would ever be let out. Many of his fellow workers had let him down and he was continually up against fierce opposition. The sharpness of the conflict is very clear in these words as he describes his opponents as dogs. Their insistence that male converts to Christianity should be circumcised was, for Paul, a denial of the message that he was proclaiming. He was convinced that salvation was by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and that circumcision was definitely not the way.

Paul's joyfulness is so irrepressible that he is keen to encourage everyone else to be joyful as well! In the next chapter he commands, "Always be full of joy in the Lord. I say it again—rejoice!" (Philippians 4.4) Paul clearly wasn't saying that everything is always going to go well. Indeed, Jesus frequently pointed out how tough it would be for those who decided to follow him. But, through it all, it is miraculously possible to be joyful, because the joy comes from our relationship with the Lord and not from

circumstances which, if they were the focus, would often and rightly make us downright miserable. Joy is one of the fruits of the Spirit which develops in us as we get closer to God and, in common with all the other fruits, it grows in us gradually and unselfconsciously as we allow Jesus to be the Lord of our lives.
