



With five manuals and eighty-four speaking stops,

Pope Leo has renewed the invitation that Pope Francis extended in Lisbon two years ago.

Young people from all over the world will gather together with the Pope to celebrate World Youth Day in Seoul, Korea, from 3 to 8 August 2027.

The theme will be "Take courage! I have overcome the world!" (Jn 16:33).

Pope Leo commented, "It is precisely the hope that dwells in our hearts that gives us the strength to proclaim the victory of the risen Christ over evil and death; and you, young pilgrims of hope, will be witnesses of this to the ends of the earth! I look forward to seeing you in Seoul: let us continue to dream together and to hope together".

First female archbishop 'kept sexuality secret for years'

The new Archbishop of Wales has revealed she kept her sexuality secret for decades as she struggled to be accepted in the Anglican communion.

The Most Rev Cherry Vann is now the UK's first female and first openly homosexual archbishop after being appointed last week.

Speaking to the Guardian, the 66-year-old said that without the strong belief that God had called her to the priesthood, she "would not have survived" her journey through the ranks of the church.

She added: "It happens that I've lived in a time that's meant that I'm a trailblazer, but I'm not a campaigner.

"I'm not somebody to be out there all the time, but I do seek to be true to what I think God's asking of me."

The archbishop has worked in the Church in Wales since 2020 after becoming Bishop of Monmouth.

At the time, she publicly disclosed her civil partnership with Wendy Diamond, her partner of 30 years. Before that, she served in the Church of England as Archdeacon of Rochdale between 2008 and 2020.

Ms Vann explained that working in the Church in Wales has been very different because clergy are permitted to be in same-sex civil partnerships. However, in the Church of England, same-sex relationships are technically allowed, but gay clergy are expected to remain celibate.

She added: "Other people in England were braver than I was and made their sexuality clear. A lot of them suffered the consequences of that, certainly when going forward for ordination."

Ms Vann said being a woman in the church had been difficult enough, adding: "You can hide your sexuality, up to

a point, but you can't hide being a woman. There was a lot of nastiness; the men were angry, they felt they had been betrayed."

The former archbishop Andy John announced in June he would be stepping down with immediate effect after an alcohol-fuelled financial, bullying and sexual misconduct scandal at Bangor Cathedral.

Mr John was not accused of wrongdoing, but calls for his resignation gathered pace after summaries of two reports were published and six "serious incident reports" were sent to the Charity Commission.
