

Light Beyond the Water

A response by Susan Boyle and Andrea Bocelli

"On July 11, as the world reeled from the devastating Texas floods, Susan Boyle received a quiet phone call from Andrea Bocelli. "We don't need a perfect song—we need presence," he said gently.

The very next morning, in a modest studio tucked away in Florence, without producers, without planning, the two recorded Light Beyond the Water. It wasn't meant for charts. It wasn't made for attention. It was born out of grief.

When Susan was shown the list—111 lives lost, nearly 30 of them children—she broke down in tears. Andrea reached for her hand and said softly, "Let's sing as if they can still hear us."

There was no press release. No camera crew. No ambition beyond honoring the silence. Just a candlelit church, a lone piano, a violin, and two voices etched by sorrow and reverence. As their final harmony faded into stillness, a message appeared on the screen:

"In Memory of the Texas Flood Victims – July 2025." And for one solemn moment, music became a place to mourn... and to heal."

The people of Calary Parish in the Diocese of Glendalough continued their support of Sr Mary Killeen's work with street children in Nairobi in a new way this summer.

Over many years the parish has raised funds for the Mukuru Promotion Centre in Nairobi, Kenya, of which Sr Mary is the director. This July they held a magnificent garden party in the grounds of Calary Church to celebrate St Mary's 40 years of working with the children in the Mukuri slums. The event was a huge success and has so far has raised €5588.80 for the Mukuru Promotion Centre.

The event was attended by Sr Mary who spoke of the poverty and dangers endured by the children on a daily basis. The MPC takes in and looks after as many children

as possible. Most learn a trade and go on to become breadwinners for their families.

Calary usually holds a concert and supper for MPC so the garden party was a new venture and one which Calary's Derek Neilson describes as daunting given the vagaries of the Irish weather.

"However, the event was a huge success and we would like to thank both those who came and joined us on the day and also other friends who were unable to make it but have sent donations," he said. "All donations go directly to provide the basic needs of the children – food, hot water, school books and other essentials."

He paid tribute to all who provided the afternoon tea and to the Stedfast Brass Band whose talented musicians entertained those present.

Ireland took part in this prestigious event, and our boys delivered an outstanding ;performance.


Jake and Marlo won the U19 Team Champions, with Jake winning the Nett Individual Title and Marlo finishing as Runner-Up.

A Flower Child of Arnhem

Pictured above is Willemien Rieken. She was only 9 years old when she first began laying flowers on the grave of William Edmond, a British soldier who fought and died to liberate her Dutch Village.

From the day he died, and for 75 years, she looked after his grave and kept his memory alive.

During WWII, William served with the 1st Airborne Reconnaissance Squadron and took part in the Battle of

October 7, 2025

Arnhem in the Netherlands. Sadly, on September 17, 1944, he was shot in the back by a German sniper and fell to the ground.

One of his comrades, St David Christie, rushed to his aid, but nothing could be done to save William. Seconds before dying, he said to David: "Tell my wife I love her." This British soldier was then buried at the Arnhem Oosterbeek War Cemetery.

Willemien Rieken passed away in 2020. She was one of the last surviving Flower Children, young people who laid flowers at hundreds of graves of Allied casualties in a ceremony after the end of the war.

Niall Cherry, secretary of the Arnhem 1944 Fellowship, said: "She was one of the last surviving Dutch civilian links to the Battle of Arnhem. Willemien was a lovely lady who tended to the grave of Trooper Edmund for many years. She will be sadly missed."
