One Single Act social media campaign

Episcopalians invited to share stories of care, connection and courage to social media

The Episcopal Diocese of New York, the Cathedral Church of St. John the Divine in New York City and other faith partners have launched a new social media campaign aimed at helping people share the good things taking place in their communities.

Called One Single Act and using the social media tag #onesingleact, the 100-day project was announced July 1 from the cathedral steps.

New York Bishop Matthew Heyd said during the launch event that when people experience "chaos, cruelty and carelessness" in the world around them, one antidote is to respond with "care, connection and courage." Sharing the good things they see taking place — or doing one themselves — are "the deepest expressions of our faith."

The Very Rev. Winnie Varghese, the cathedral's new dean, told Episcopal News Service she knows people can feel powerless in the face of huge global and local forces that affect them. But this campaign offers people a chance to emphasize a very fundamental spiritual value.

"How we engage with one another, engage the stranger, engage our neighbor, is actually a fundamental power to be the conduit for God's love in the world," she said.

The campaign's encouragement to see or to do, and then share, one single act daily is "a really accessible way to make a pretty complex spiritual reality manifest in people's lives," she said. And she intentionally has been trying to be more aware of good things happening in the world so she can add her own stories.



Heyd told ENS he is finding that people across the diocese and beyond "intuitively understand what the campaign is about." He said organizers wanted to make it easy to do and to share acts of goodness, whether big or small, across social media platforms. "I'm excited to be surprised by what we hear people are doing and the places we are hearing it," he added.

He hopes this campaign gives people a way to express the fact "that the world is transformed by our connections with each other."

Among Facebook posts using the hashtag include a man sharing a music-themed drawing given to him by a young fellow parishioner; a photo from St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Durham, North Carolina, of a cooler of chilled bottled water at the entrance to their courtyard; and a video of a favorite piece of music. An Instagram photo shows a smiling man "using his first day of retirement" to set up the food pantry at St. Mary's Castleton, on Staten Island, New York.

The other partners in One Single Act are Episcopal Charities, Episcopal Divinity School and the Interfaith Center of New York.

Fifty-three graduate from Down & Dromore Diocesan Bible Courses

Congratulations to the incredible total of 53 graduates of the Diocesan Bible Courses who were awarded their certificates at the end of June!



Archdeacon Jim Cheshire made the presentations on the last night of each course.

Twenty-six people completed the 1 Year Course which ran in Banbridge on Wednesday evenings and twenty-seven graduated from the 2 Year Course (above) which ran in St Donard's on Tuesdays.

The feedback from both has been overwhelmingly positive and demonstrates a hunger for more of the same. Here are just a few of the comments:

It was fantastic and really opened the Bible for me. Made me think of things I've never thought of before, even passages I've read over and over.

One of the things I enjoyed most about the course was making links between Old Testament and New Testament. The course brought 'the Bible to life.

There was no pressure on me to do exams, everything was explained very clearly, which meant that I didn't feel out of my depth.

I had some lovely times of fellowship, and this has been one of the best things I've ever done.

The courses were devised and taught by Josh Hooker, a Crosslinks Mission Partner who has spent 17 years teaching the Bible in southern Africa. Josh and his wife Cathy have been seconded to the diocese for three years and are returning to Namibia in the autumn. We are very grateful to them for all they have contributed to the life of Down and Dromore.



What's next?

In the coming year the diocese will run the 1 Year Course again in Banbridge and hopefully also in Belfast on a different evening. We will have new teachers but the same wonderful experience!

A reminder that the 1 Year Diocesan Bible Course is for Christians at any stage on their journey with God who want to know more about the Bible and how it relates to their lives. No prior theological knowledge or qualifications are needed. It comprises three modules each 10 weeks long, beginning in October and ending in June.

Pope Leo arrives at lakeside residence of Castel Gandolfo for two-week summer break

Pope Leo has travelled to the lakeside town of Castel Gandolfo, on the outskirts of Rome, where he will spend a two-week summer break, reviving a centuries-old tradition that had been interrupted by his predecessor.

The Vatican has owned a papal palace in the town, including vast Renaissance-style gardens, since 1596, but Francis, who shunned much of the pomp and privilege of the papacy, chose not to take vacations, spending the summer in his Vatican residence.

In contrast, Leo, who was elected pope on 8th May, has decided to take a break during his first summer in office,

escaping the heatwave in Rome to enjoy the cooler temperatures in Castel Gandolfo, on the shores of Lake Albano.

Business owners in the town, home to around 8,900 people, hope for a tourism boost during the pope's stay, which will conclude on 20th July. He may also return to the lakeshore for at least one weekend in August.

While Leo is expected to spend most of his holiday out of the public eye, residents and tourists will have the opportunity to see him at religious celebrations on 13th July and 20th July.

Traffic & Travel Notice: There will be a number of parades taking place throughout the Causeway Coast & Glens District over the July 12th period, with main demonstrations taking place in Coleraine and Rasharkin.

In Coleraine, the larger feeder parade will begin at 9.15am at Union Street following a route to Waterside for the assembly of the main parade. The main parade will move off from Waterside at 11.15am with the outward route completing at approximately 2pm, before the return parade begins at 3.15pm and disperses at approximately 5.30pm.

The main parade in Rasharkin will begin at 1pm and finish at approximately 6pm.

Officers will be on the ground across all main parades and traffic management will be in place to assist with traffic flow. If you are not attending the parades this year please bear in mind the potential for delays.

With the increased volume of traffic already on the roads due to The Open, it's advisable to find an alternative route.

Ken Goodall's Lions Cap

The Mark Patterson Show on BBC Radio Foyle produced this topical and much - cherished memento of the Derry rugby player.

It had lain in an office in Dublin for decades, but finally this week, legendary Derry rugby player Ken Goodall's one and only British and Irish Lions cap has been given to his family.





Many serious rugby heads in the late 60's and 70's reckoned Ken - a former Faughan Valley HS Principal - was the finest forward playing in the northern hemisphere.



In his early days he played for Foyle College and City of Derry. Then came Ulster, Newcastle University, Ireland, the Barbarians and the Lions. He was only a teenager when he made his Ireland debut in 1967. Because he was so young, he was only a squad member on the 1968 Lions tour of South Africa but played once, scored, and broke his hand, ending his Tour. Ken Goodall died in 2006.
