Methodists and Anglicans unite to equip churches for wartime

The Methodist Conference in Telford has received a fresh call to strengthen support for its military chaplains as global tensions grow.

A report from the Methodist Forces Board warns that rising security threats mean church communities need to understand what it means to "be church" during times of conflict and be ready with practical and theological resources.



Sole Mates numbers reduced slightly as they negotiated the second stage through narrow passageways and rocky overhangs on the edge of the sea, to the base of Blackhead.

Ecumenical work with the Church of England is already underway to create materials rooted in scripture and Methodist teaching to help churches reflect on issues of war and peace and offer better support for military personnel and their families.

Rev Kevin Highfield, Chair of the Forces Board, said the Church must adapt its mindset: "This work may involve a significant mental shift from the long period of relative peace that Europe has experienced... Our processes are currently designed for periods of stability and peace. It may become necessary to discern a call to chaplaincy from a wider range of ministerial experience than at present."



Sole Mates returned to Whitehead, fellowship continued after their walk as they adjourned to a local 'hostelry' for a very enjoyable lunch before catching their train back to Belfast.

He told Premier Christian News he hopes the announcement will help ease growing anxiety as global tensions rise, saying: "We want to be a church that is providing healing and hope to the people around us the best we can...And to do that, we need some resources that recognise the reality of the situation we're currently facing and says well how then do we do church?"

Contributions to the fund come directly from Church of Ireland dioceses and since its establishment in 1980 over €20 million (£17 million) has been distributed in grants.

The following categories are currently supported by the fund:

Training – lay and ordained
Christian education
Outreach initiatives
Innovative ministry in a rural context
The closing date for the receipt of completed applications is Friday, 31st October 2025.

Decisions on funding are approved at the March meeting of the General Synod's Standing Committee each year, following consideration by the Priorities Fund Committee.

Methody Rowing Club makes history at the Irish Rowing Championships 2025

Methodist College Belfast's Rowing Club has achieved success at the 2025 Irish Rowing Championships, marking a historic moment for the school and the wider rowing community.

In a performance of exceptional calibre, the club secured 8 medals—including 4 golds, 2 silvers, and 2 bronzes—representing our first medal success at the Championships since 2004.

A particular highlight was the outstanding achievement of Sophia Young, who made history by winning gold in all three



sculling events—a first for Methody and a rare accomplishment in Irish rowing.


