Lord Eames celebrates 50 years of service as bishop



Half a century of service in episcopal ministry was celebrated on Monday morning (on St Columba's Day) when a congregation gathered for a Choral Eucharist in St Columb's Cathedral, Londonderry, to mark the fiftieth anniversary of the consecration of Bishop Robin Eames.

Lord Eames served as Bishop of Derry and Raphoe from 1975 to 1980, and thereafter Bishop of Down and Dromore, and Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of All Ireland from 1986 until his retirement in 2006. He was consecrated in St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh, on 9th June 1975, by Archbishop George Otto Simms, at 38 years of age.

The service was led by Archbishop John McDowell and the preacher was Bishop Andrew Forster, the current Bishop of Derry and Raphoe. Bishop George Davison (Bishop of

Connor), Bishop Ian Ellis (Bishop of Clogher) and Bishop Patrick Rooke (formerly Bishop of Tuam, Killala and Achonry) were also present, and Archdeacon Mark Harvey (Archdeacon of Dromore) represented Bishop David McClay (Bishop of Down and Dromore).

Scripture was read by Bishop Forster and Dean Shane Forster (Dean of Armagh) and intercessions led by Archdeacon Robert Miller (Archdeacon of Derry).

A reception was held afterwards in the Chapter Room, giving many representatives from parish life in the diocese, and guests who had travelled from elsewhere, the opportunity to congratulate Lord Eames, Lady Christine Eames and their sons Michael and Niall.

The Church of England on June 11 unveiled plans to invest more than £1.6 billion in the work of churches over the next three years – a 36 per cent rise on the national funding made available in 2022 for the current three-year period.

The distributions from the Church Commissioners, which manages the Church's national endowment fund, will support key priorities such as



- a major package of measures forclergy well-being
- supporting parishes in the lowest income communities
- safeguarding and redress


Ministry of the Diocese, each group played a vital role in making the evening a joyful celebration of faith.

Anglican Communion declaration to foster public support for ocean protection

On Monday an advocacy group representing multiple faiths and traditions at the United Nations Ocean Conference, including the Anglican Communion, launched a declaration for public support.

This document was drafted with collaboration from multiple faith groups and the Anglican communion's United Nations representatives, to show support for several proposed policy recommendations, including:

The protection and restoration of at least 30% of our ocean by 2030



A moratorium on deep-sea mining



To ratify and implement the High Seas Treaty



To address marine pollution comprehensively

To recognise the ocean's vital role in regulating climate and support ocean-based climate solutions

The Pantry at Queen's

The Russell Group's new briefing, Building Opportunity For All, looks at ways universities are supporting students to not only access university, but thrive during their studies.

It also highlights how government needs to be a partner in this mission. One way they can do this is by improving maintenance support to help students facing financial barriers - reviewing parental thresholds that determine loan support, and reintroducing grants for the poorest students.

Our universities are all doing what they can to help students overcome financial worries. At Queen's University Belfast, the university and Queen's Students' Union teamed up to launch The Pantry - a free essential food refill station which has been accessed almost 40,000 times to date.

The Pantry model differs from traditional food banks in that it doesn't just provide access to food and essential goods, but also provides support for students to develop skills in budgeting, debt management, cooking, meal preparation and nutrition.
