New rector for St Paul's, Lisburn.

Bishop Darren McCartney, rector of Clonallon and Warrenpoint with Kilbroney, Diocese of Down and Dromore, has been appointed rector of St Paul's, Lisburn.

Darren spent his formative years in Dundrod, Co Antrim, growing up close to the Ulster Grand Prix motorbike circuit.

He attended Lisnagarvey High School and later spent eight years as a plant engineer before training for the ministry and taking up a post as deacon-in-charge and then priest-in-

Darren returned to Northern Ireland in 2006 and spent three years as a curate in St Nicholas', Carrickfergus, before becoming rector of St Matthias, Knocknamuckley. In June 2012, during the Diocesan Arctic



Synod, he was elected and consecrated Suffragan Bishop of the Arctic and moved with his wife Karen to Iqaluit, Baffin Island, in January 2013.

Darren has been married to Karen 24 years and they have one son. The family returned to Northern Ireland in 2019 when Darren took up the post of rector of Clonallon and Warrenpoint with Kilbroney. He is also Area Dean for the Mourne, and Warden to the Pioneering Ministers in the Diocese of Down and Dromore.

Looking forward to his move to Lisburn, Darren said: "The journey that has brought us to this point makes me very interested to see what God has in front of us. I rest in the

Millions flock to drama that shows 'humanity of Jesus'

Jonathan Roumie plays Jesus in 'The Chosen', which has drawn 520 million viewers, Dalya Alberge writes. In The Sunday Telegraph.

While so many modern television dramas are filled with foul language, explicit sex and drugs, viewers are turning in their millions to some of the oldest stories in history – those of the Bible.

If the Church is wondering where its flocks have gone, it may find that they are watching The Chosen, a drama about the life of Jesus, that has drawn 520 million viewers worldwide.

More than 110 million people in 175 countries have watched at least one episode. The Crown, Netflix's hit drama series about Queen Elizabeth II and events that shaped her reign, reached 73 million households globally over a similar period of its first three seasons. In the UK alone, since 2019, The Chosen has attracted 11 million show views on various platforms.

It has become an global phenomenon in which viewers have spread the word.

Now there are plans to make it available in 600 languages, with major Hollywood player, Lionsgate, having acquired global distribution rights.

The show tells the story of Jesus's life and ministry, through the eyes of the people who knew him. Its creator is Dallas Jenkins, who directed and produced over a dozen feature and short films for Universal and Lionsgate, among others.

He said that the idea of tens of millions of people watching The Chosen is "so crazy that, if I actually try to think about why or how it happened, it would be too overwhelming".

Scholars from Protestant, Catholic and Jewish backgrounds vet every script, checking for biblical, historical and cultural accuracy, while allowing for artistic licence.

'It's a show that captures the birth of a religion, but it's also a drama that non-believers can appreciate' Referring to The Crown, which imagines dialogue between members of the Royal family, Jenkins said that they strive to capture the authenticity of the time while also being creative. "This is a story that's not in the Bible. But we also know it's historically accurate... This is not a religious show. It's a show that happens to capture the birth of a religion, but it's also a historical drama that even non-believers... can appreciate."

He added: "Even a lot of shows that I love, like Succession, Peaky Blinders and The Wire... there's a lack of sentimentalism and optimism.

"Those shows are typically from a more cynical world view...
But I do think that most viewers want a mix... The Chosen is unafraid...to celebrate joy and love more than the opposite, more than cynicism, [portraying] a figure who lived a perfect life and who inspired billions with love."

Jesus is played by Jonathan Roumie, who was even invited to speak with Pope Francis about his role. Jenkins said: "The Vatican invited us... Jonathan is a practising Catholic, I'm Protestant, an evangelical. He had an opportunity to discuss with the Pope and other religious leaders the responsibility that he has to accurately portray this figure, this man revered by so many. [The Pope] made a joke about Jonathan playing Jesus and asked if I was Judas... I think that shows his emotional intelligence and humour."

The Chosen portrays Jesus as God and man. Jenkins said: "We do show him doing miracles, we do show him as the Son of God, but we also show his humanity, show him dancing with friends at a wedding and telling jokes, laughing... and being sad.

"These are all things that I think most people are responding to... but it's rarely been portrayed."


