Archbishop attends annual 1916 State Commemoration

Archbishop Michael Jackson represented the Church of Ireland at the annual State ceremony to commemorate the



Archbishop Michael Jackson with Faith Leaders at the Grave of the 1916 Leaders. Easter Rising and the executed leaders of 1916 at Arbour Hill in Dublin on Wednesday May 3.

Hosted by the Tánaiste and Minister for Defence Micheál Martin, the event was attended by President Michael D Higgins and his wife Sabina, and Taoiseach Leo Varadkar as well as Lord Mayor Caroline Conroy, members of the Government and the Oireachtas, the Council of State, the Judiciary and relatives of the leaders and others who fought in 1916.

Arbour Hill is the final resting place of the seven signatories of the Proclamation of the Republic, including Padraig Pearse and James Connolly, as well as other executed 1916 leaders.

Following Requiem Mass in the Church of the Sacred Heart, the church for the Defence Forces, a ceremony took place at the Grave for the 1916 Leaders at which Faith Leaders, including Archbishop Jackson, led prayers. President Higgins laid a wreath and led a minute's silence in memory of those who died in 1916.

The annual commemoration at Arbour Hill is the longest—running State ceremony to commemorate the Easter Rising. It is 100 years since the commemoration at Arbour Hill began in 1923, shortly after the end of the Civil War, and the first State commemoration event took place in 1924.

A commemoration event has been held each year since, including two years of scaled back ceremonies at Arbour Hill due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The commemorations resumed in full last year.

Cash, Ferns and Ossory review

On Saturday April 29th the Diocesan Review Commission presented its Report to the members of the Diocesan Synod at a special meeting convened at Butler House in Kilkenny College.

Bishop Adrian Wilkinson was in the chair and guided the proceedings.



The Diocesan Review Commission was set up by Diocesan Synod in June 2019 to facilitate a comprehensive review of parochial and diocesan life, and to set in train a process which would help set priorities and plans for the future. Over the past 4 years, the Commission visited all the parishes in the Diocese and met those invested in or interested in the mission and ministry of the Church.

The Report was presented by Dorcas Collier Hannon, the chair of the Commission. It was favourably received by the members of Synod who contributed to a wide ranging discussion of its findings and recommendations. Towards the end of the Synod, a motion was passed which permitted the election of a Bishop's Advisory Group which will take this



work forward. The names of the clergy and lay people elected to this group will be published next week. The meeting ended with prayer and presentation to the members of the Diocesan Review Commission. The Bishop thanked them for all their valuable work.

The Diocesan Magazine will have an article on the day's proceedings in the June issue.

A privilege and honour to take part in the Coronation - Moderator

The Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, Right Reverend Dr John Kirkpatrick, has said that "...it will be a privilege to be able to take part in the King's Coronation and an honour to be able to represent Irish Presbyterians at such a unique and historic occasion..."

Dr Kirkpatrick was speaking from London where he took part in a rehearsal at Westminster Abbey ahead of the ceremony.

While his predecessor, Dr John McKean, was a guest at the late Queen's Coronation in 1953, this is believed to be the first time that a Moderator, along with his fellow Church Leaders from the island of Ireland, will be taking part in Saturday's historic event, as they process together ahead of the King and Queen Consort at the start of the service.

"For all the pomp and pageantry, and amongst the symbolism and all the spectacle, at its very heart is a Christian service of dedication and blessing. It is a great

privilege to be able to take part in the King's Coronation and an honour to be able to represent Irish Presbyterians at such a unique and historic occasion that hasn't been seen for 70 years," Dr Kirkpatrick said.

"As people tune in on Saturday to see King Charles crowned, it will be for many people, especially in Northern Ireland, a special moment. With Coronation services taking place across our denomination on Sunday, along with an array of community events to mark the occasion in which our churches are involved, this is also a time of thanksgiving and celebration."

The Moderator continued, "As a Christian leader, and a witness in the Abbey representing my brothers and sisters in Christ of all ages back home in PCI, the Coronation is a reminder of the meaningful place that Christianity still has in the fabric of national life.

"The service reminds us as well of the biblical call to pray for those in authority, without fear or favour, in the name of the King of Kings, while acknowledging the Grace of God that King Charles will need in order to do all that he is called to do. The Coronation also speaks to us of where we can find truth. For when the King is presented with the Bible, he is told that it is '...the most valuable thing that this world affords."

Dr Kirkpatrick concluded by saying, "While Moderators have been privileged to attend the inauguration of the Presidents of Ireland and other national events and commemorations, we are also in a unique position to be able to represent our people at state occasions in the United Kingdom. My

predecessor Dr Bruce, for example, took part in the Service of Thanksgiving for Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee at St Paul's Cathedral last June, while I took part in the State Funeral following her death in September. Tomorrow is another opportunity to bear witness to, and be part of, a very special moment in time."
