Further reports on Channel 4 News investigation, broadcast last night, about how a former chair of Trustees with the Christian non-denominational charity the Iwerne Trust, used to violently beat boys. *Tel* and *Times* focus on further allegations made against John Smyth when he went to Zimbabwe, while Ch 4 notes police have opened an investigation. *Guard* focuses on response from Winchester College, where some of the survivors had attended. The Archbishop of Canterbury, who was a dormitory leader on the English camps in the 1970s, is quoted issuing an unreserved and unequivocal apology.
