The Archbishop is quoted voicing "profound grief and sorrow" after hearing the testimonies of Palestinians whose land is behind the separation barrier. He is quoted as saying: "In any place where there's serious conflict, there's a point where you need to talk to everyone, but it has got to be the point where you can make some progress.
