Ombudsman says no justifiable reason to maintain 'old school tie' admissions

Schools to be allowed to reserve up to 25% of places for past pupils. The Ombudsman for Children has said there is "no justifiable reason" to allow schools to give children of past pupils priority in their enrolment. At present, schools – especially in the fee-paying sector – are free to set aside as many places as they wish for children of past pupils. Minister for Education Richard Bruton's new School Admission Bill will place a 25 per cent cap on the number of school places that may be set aside.

DUP: Introduce UK-wide law protecting soldiers from prosecution

Prime Minister Theresa May's DUP allies have urged the Government to introduce UK-wide laws protecting soldiers in multiple wars from prosecution.

Lagan Valley MP Sir Jeffrey Donaldson said a statute of limitations for the armed forces should also cover conflicts like Iraq and Afghanistan. He warned that confining it to Northern Ireland could lead to IRA pressure for an amnesty. Senior members of the Cabinet, including Defence Secretary Gavin Williamson, had expressed concerns that military veterans might not have enough protection under a proposed system for addressing historic wrongdoing in Northern Ireland.
