

### Ascension



### New honourary chaplain to King Charles III selected

Rev Kalantha Brewis, the rector of Hallow and Grimley with Holt and Lower Broadheathas, has been appointed alongside her new role as area dean for Worcester.

Her appointment as royal chaplain was formally recognised during a Buckingham Palace garden party, where she was presented to the Prince and Princess of Wales. As part of her new responsibilities, h will preach annually at the Chapel Royal and is entitled to wear a scarlet cassock, signifying her service to the monarch.

She said: "It was a complete surprise to have been nominated for this honour by the former Bishop of Worcester.

"I took our benefice administrator Lorna with me to the garden party as it was important to me to take someone from the community which I seek to serve and who support me in my ministry."

The role of area dean includes supporting clergy, lay leaders and parishes in collaboration with diocesan leadership.

Kalantha praised the team she'll be working with: "This is a fantastic deanery with lovely people... the leadership team are really dynamic and already have a strong sense of purpose, particularly in developing work with children and young people."

Reflecting on her unexpected calling, she added: "God is always leading us into unexpected situations, and I feel God is calling me into this new chapter of my ministry".

### Mass of Installation of Archbishop of Liverpool

The Most Rev John Sherrington has officially taken up his role as the tenth Archbishop of Liverpool, following

He succeeds Archbishop Malcolm McMahon OP, who stepped down after 11 years of service.

Reflecting on the occasion, Archbishop John said: "The Mass of Installation was a joyous occasion. It was wonderful to see so many people from across the diocese and beyond gather together in prayer as we continue to preach Christ to the people of our time."

He added: "I give thanks to Archbishop Malcolm who has served the archdiocese with love and generosity, and I am honoured to succeed him."

# Digital demands in RE teaching focus for Stranmillis final year student

This week, final year student teachers from Stranmillis University College became the first cohort to take part in a newly launched Digital Skills Academy course,



#### delivered through the Centre for Digital Innovation and Technology (CDIT).

This initiative marks a significant step in a collaborative effort between further and higher education providers and industry partners across Northern Ireland to enhance digital skills training.

Developed in partnership with Belfast Metropolitan College as part of the Belfast Digital Skills and Employability Programme—funded by Bank of America—the academy focuses on equipping future educators with the digital competencies necessary for modern classrooms.

The programme also aligns with the NI Executive's educational reform strategy, 'A Fair Start', which emphasises the importance of training teachers in digital skills to combat educational underachievement.

Leading the programme for Stranmillis, Head of STEM, Dr Irene Bell said "Stranmillis University College is delighted to be delivering the first course for ITE students of the CDIT Digital Skills Academy. Through this advanced, accredited course, the newly qualified teachers will be ideally positioned to develop the digital skills of the next generation."

Among the inaugural participants were Amy Elliott, a final year student in Post-Primary Religious Studies, and Rachel Dunbar, studying Primary Education. ### **Story of Carrickfergus and Limerick**

When General Schomberg came to Ireland on 13th August 1689 he was accompanied by an army chaplain called George Story.

George was an apologist for the General.Whenever Schomberg came under criticism for his handling of the war in Ireland it was Story who defended the General.

During the week long siege of Carrickfergus Castle and town in 1689 one of the siege cannon balls fell in the grounds of Saint Nicholas church, and was only discovered centuries later when grave diggers where digging a grave;it is now on display in the entrance porch of the church.

George served with the Williamits throughout the war, including the battle of the Boyne, fought on 1st July 1690.

George would write his eye witness account of the war in his;"an impartial history of the wars of Ireland".

After the Treaty of Limerick was signed on 3 October 1691, bringing the war to an end, Story's regiment marched back to Ulster, and In December 1694 Story was appointed **Dean of Connor**; but he was also appointed the **Rector of Saint Nicholas Church in Carrickfergus**.

So the Rev George Story has a big connection with Saint Nicholas church in Carric. On the 7 April 1705 he was appointed **Dean of Limerick.**George died on 19 November 1721. Courtesy of Mark Porter
