Reports that two blasts targeting Coptic Christians in Egypt on Palm Sunday have killed at least 47 people and injured more than 100. An explosion at St George's Coptic Church in Tanta killed 29 people and hours later a blast outside St Mark's Coptic Church in Alexandria left 18 dead. A statement by the General Bishop of the Coptic Orthodox Church in the UK, Bishop Angaelos, is quoted in reports condemning the "senseless and heartless" brutality of the attacks. CNN reports the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, who urged prayer for the victims, as being amongst the international condemnation of the attacks. Christian Today publishes a prayer posted on social media by the Church of England.

Report that 46 schools have sought exemptions since 2015 from the legal requirement to provide a daily act of Christian worship with many choosing "non faith" or "multi faith" alternatives for the first time. The report quotes Rev Nigel Genders Chief Education Officer at the Church of England, as saying that the low number of

schools that chose exemption from Christian worship showed daily collective action had "proved a powerful tool in bringing pupils together, giving them a rare opportunity to pause".
