### SUPPORT FOR IMPACT OF BEREAVEMENT

Sir, The government's recently introduced bereavement support payments reduce the availability of support for widows, widowers and their children to only 18 months. Bereavement is a crushing burden and its impact can last for far longer than this, especially in families with children.

The Church of England conducts about 150,000 funerals annually and supports families often for years afterwards. I know from first-hand pastoral experience that many bereaved families are not ready to stand on their own feet so quickly.

f the government is serious about this payment providing much-needed support during the most crucial years of the bereavement process, then three years of support should be considered the minimum, especially where children are involved. Anything less does a great wrong to those who are already suffering. Universal credit, with its conditions and focus on increasing work hours for single parents, is not appropriate for a young family still coming to terms with grief.
