Christian peer celebrates 60 years of women in the House of Lords - 'the last bastion of all-male benches is beginning to change'

The Life Peerages Act of 1958 was introduced by Harold Macmillan's Conservative government and allowed women in the House of Lords for the first time. It was the first cog in the wheel of rejuvenating the almost entirely hereditary membership there. Baroness Sal Brinton, the President of the Liberal Democrats, told Premier: "I think actually our politics in the United Kingdom would have been very different because, although I think that women have changed the tone and the way both houses work... there's also been something about the progress of women in the House of Lords itself in politics."
