

## Restructured MTh degree agreed by Trinity and C of I Theological Institute

Trinity College Dublin and the Church of Ireland Theological Institute have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) revised agreement today (6th September 2018) for the continued joint delivery of the Master's course in Theology.

The Provost, Dr Patrick Prendergast and the Archbishop of Dublin, the Most Revd Dr Michael Jackson signed the MOU and were joined by Dr Maurice Elliott, Master in Theology Course Director and Director of the Church of Ireland Theological Institute, and Professor Paula Murphy, Registrar of Trinity College Dublin and Chair of the Course Management Committee.

The Master in Theology course offers a distinctive learning experience which integrates the fields of theology, biblical studies and Christian practice and is the principal pathway leading to ordained ministry in the Church of Ireland. The joint delivery provides for the integration of academic components through Trinity's School of Religion and professional vocational components and theoretical components led by the Church of Ireland Theological Institute (CITI). The MOU provides the inter–institutional arrangements for the joint delivery and management of the course. The current Master's Programme was established in 2009 and recently, following very positive external review, has been restructured with an enhanced suite of modules.

### Death of C of I chaplain who served in Korean war

The death has taken place of the Reverend Canon T R (Bob) Jennings BA. He died on 3 Sept 2018 aged 94. He was a Church of Ireland clergyman.

Canon Jennings served in the RAChD, the Royal Army Chaplains Department, as a Regular Chaplain 1951 – 1967. He served in Korea with 1 Bn The Welch Regiment 1951 – 52. His last posting with the RAChd was 14th/20th Hussars 1966- 67.

He was the beloved husband of the late Jean, much loved father of Kerry, Rosaleen, Clodagh, Katie and Robert, dearly loved grandfather of Nick, Kit, Simon, Jeannie, Kerry, Adam, Emily, Sarah and Jack and great-grandfather of Eli, Jacob, Indi and Ariella; sadly missed by his daughter-in-law Irene,

sons-in-law Malcolm, Jack and Pat, surviving siblings Stanley and Sheila and a wide circle of family and friends. Reposing at Colliers Funeral Home, Old Connaught Avenue, Bray.

# Church of South Sudan's national youth coordinator killed in gun attack in Irish-linked diocese

The national youth coordinator for the Episcopal Church of South Sudan (ECSS) has died after being shot while travelling to Yei.

Thousands of young people gathered at the house of Joseph Kiri on Monday to pay their respects for the youth worker and evangelist, who was killed just days after the Primate of South Sudan, Archbishop Justin Badi Arama, said more needed to be done to turn a peace deal on paper into peace on the ground.

In addition to his work with the ECSS, Joseph Kiri worked for a church humanitarian organisation Across. He was shot near the village of Limbe, a few kilometres away from Yei, when unknown gunmen targeted his NGO vehicle. He was travelling to Yei to deliver field reports for Across, where he worked as a nutrition officer. The diocese of Yei is linked with Connor. Several clergy and lay members from Connor have visited their linked diocese and received visitors from Yei.

The Executive Director of Across, Elisama Wani Daniel, said that Kiri died instantly after being shot in the chest as the vehicle was sprayed with bullets. His driver, Maliamungu, managed to escape and ran to a military base at Limbe. Soldiers rushed to the scene of the attack and recovered Kiri's body, which was transferred to the capital Juba.

In a Tweet, the Primate of South Sudan, Archbishop Justin Badi Arama, said that he and his wife, Mama Joyce, were "deeply saddened to hear of the passing of the Provincial Youth Coordinator, Joseph Kiri, in an ambush on Lainya – Yei road.

"Our prayers are with his family. We ask all parties to respect the ceasefire."

The Provincial Secretary of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan, John Augustino Lumori, described Kiri as "a talented, sound and vibrant youth". He described his death as "a very big loss to the entire Episcopal Church of South Sudan."

Many senior church leaders have condemned the barbaric act done to innocent civilians in a humanitarian car. They have urged all those holding guns countrywide to respect civilians who are unarmed as well as humanitarian agencies.

Recently a United Nations peace-keeping soldier from Bangladesh was killed in a similar act, after armed men shot from the bush on humanitarian conveys. The shooting

was condemned by the UN humanitarian coordinator in South Sudan.

Despite the signed cessation of hostilities in Khartoum between the parties to the conflict, there has been little sign of the parties showing their commitment to what they have signed.

#### +++Curate's introduced to South Donegal parishioners -

Members of the Grouped Parishes of Inver, Mountcharles, Killaghtee and Killybegs got a first opportunity to meet their new Curate since her ordination, last weekend, when Rev Lindsey Farrell was introduced formally to parishioners at a Service in St John's Church in Inver on Tuesday evening. The church was filled to capacity for the Service of Introduction, which was led by the Bishop of Derry and Raphoe, Rt Rev Ken Good, and attended by Church of Ireland clergy from throughout the Diocese of Raphoe, many representatives of other Christian denominations in south Donegal and local politicians. Also in the congregation were Rev Lindsey Farrell's husband, Keith, their three children and all four of the children's grandparents. The sermon was preached by the Rector of Drumholm, Kilbarron and Rossnowlagh, Rev Canon Brian Russell, who said it was a great delight to welcome the Farrell family "to all things south Donegal" and more particularly to the family of believers in the Inver community of parishes. "That the church people here will have a minister to love and to respect, and that Lindsey will have a people to love and serve, is very good news indeed," he said. While training for the ordained ministry, Rev Farrell had been on a ten-week placement in Canon Russell's Drumholm Group of parishes. He told the congregation that she had grown up in the parish of Rossorry, in Enniskillen, where she and Keith had played a vital part in the fellowship and work among young families in Irvinestown.
