



## Methodist Church to Reflect on Human Sexuality Issues

The Methodist Church in Ireland's Faith and Order Committee has assembled a working party to reflect on issues relating to human sexuality.

The working party includes two representatives from the Irish Methodist Youth and Children's

Department (IMYCD), and Dean John Mann, Chair of the Select Committee on Human Sexuality of the Church of Ireland.

The Working Party has received comprehensive terms of reference. These include:

- Undertaking a fundamental review of Christian teaching on human sexuality and practice
- Examining afresh how Holy Scripture may be faithfully interpreted in the Methodist Church in respect of issues concerning human sexuality
- Taking due cognisance of similar work being undertaken by sister Churches both in Ireland and elsewhere.

Other churches, undergoing similar processes have issued invitations to those with a particular or personal interest to contribute, in a strictly confidential manner, to the thinking being undertaken.

The Faith and Order Working Party, encouraged by these experiences, is now inviting anyone who would like to be heard to contact Gillian Kingston, Chair of the Working Party at <a href="mailto:wphs@irishmethodist.org">wphs@irishmethodist.org</a>.

#### THE INVITATION

The Working Party is examining matters of human sexuality, including same-sex relationships, that face the Church. Scripture, reason, tradition and experience together form the lens through which the group will reflect.

The Working Party is inviting the Methodist people in Ireland to engage in a listening process concerning issues they feel the Church should be considering. The Working Party is inviting people to participate in this listening process either as individuals or as groups.

While the content of meetings will be noted by the group and used to continue discussion by the wider Church, all submissions will remain anonymous.

# Moderator pays tribute to 'selfless and steadfast' Queen

Presbyterian Moderator, Rt. Rev. Dr. Ian McNie, has written to The Queen as she becomes the United Kingdom's longest reigning monarch.

Surpassing Queen Victoria, her great-great-grandmother, the Moderator praised the 'selfless and steadfast service' that The Queen has given since succeeding her father, King George VI, 63 years ago.

In his letter Dr. McNie said, 'While this particular Wednesday may be like any other, it marks a unique milestone in Your Majesty's long reign and in the history of the United Kingdom.

'For those of us here in Northern Ireland, Your Majesty's visits over the past six decades with The Duke of Edinburgh at your side, have encouraged many; not least during our darkest days. More recently, your State Visit to the

Republic of Ireland not only resonated with symbolism, but also broke genuine historic ground in our island's journey of reconciliation and forgiveness. As President McAleese said at the time, your visit celebrated "a new chapter" in the relationship between Britain and Ireland.'

The Moderator also said that in an increasingly secular age The Queen's personal Christian witness had shone through in her recent Christmas broadcasts, as she described the Lord Jesus as 'an inspiration and an anchor in my life.'

Dr. McNie concluded his letter by saying, 'It is for this too that I give thanks for a faithful service rendered in His Name.'

# Former Moderator leads Sunnyside's weekend celebration

Anna McCaffrey, Sunnyside's manager said, "It has been a very special weekend. Residents, families and the 50 staff make Sunnyside a special place to be. I am blessed to have met so many lovely people during the time that I have been here and over the weekend we welcomed so many people, including Rev. Ken Newell, who

laid the foundation stone during his year as Moderator," she said.

Run in partnership with Fold Housing Association, Sunnyside House has 45 single en suite rooms and welcomes residents from all denominations and seeks to provide care in a specifically Christian ethos and environment. Residents have the choice of attending regular worship services and fellowship times held within the home and a conscious effort is made to ensure residents are offered spiritual support and encouragement when requested.

Former Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, Very Rev. Dr. Ken Newell gave the address at the service of celebration at the home. "The way we care for our older citizens and how they are treated is a test of the moral character of any society and is one of the most important ministries of Christ Himself.

"The Presbyterian Church in Ireland has for many, many years worked alongside others to provide the highest standards of care. It was an absolute joy to be back again after 10 years to join in the celebrations with the residents, staff and families and to take the service on Sunday," Dr. Newell said.

Resident Gloria Speechley, who is originally from Brisbane in Australia, also enjoyed the weekend celebrations. "I came to live at Sunnyside four years ago and I am very happy here as I think Sunnyside would be hard to match."

The Church's Council for Social Witness has overall management responsibility for Sunnyside House and the 17 other projects across 14 locations. The Council seeks to deliver an effective social witness service on behalf of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland and to the wider community.

# Waterfront finale for Bangor Worldwide 2015

## Bible Week 2016 speaker

The diocese of Down and Dromore's Bible week speaker in 2016 is to be the Revd Dr Ian Provan, who has been the Marshall Sheppard Professor of Biblical Studies at Regent College, Vancouver, since 1997.

Born and educated in the UK, Dr. Provan retains strong family, academic, and church connections with his homeland. He received his MA at Glasgow University in Mediaeval History and



Archaeology, his BA from London Bible College in Theology, and his PhD from Cambridge, where his thesis focused on the books of Kings, and was subsequently published as Hezekiah and the Books of Kings. His academic teaching career took him to King's College London, the University of Wales, and the University of Edinburgh, where he was a senior lecturer in Hebrew and Old Testament Studies, Dr. Provan has written numerous essays and articles, and several books including commentaries on Lamentations, 1 and 2 Kings, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs, and co-authored with Phil Long and Tremper Longman A Biblical History of Israel (John Knox Press, 2003). Most recently he released

Against the Grain: Selected Essays (Regent College Publishing, 2015), Seriously Dangerous Religion: What the Old Testament Really Says and Why It Matters (Baylor University Press, 2014) and Convenient Myths: The Axial Age, Dark Green Religion, and the World that Never Was (Baylor University Press, 2013). His next book, Discovering Genesis, is forthcoming from SPCK at the end of 2015. After this, he plans to write and publish a book on Protestant biblical hermeneutics, projected for release in 2017.

Dr. Provan is an ordained minister of the Church of Scotland; a Life Member of Clare Hall, Cambridge; and the recipient of an Alexander von Humboldt Research Fellowship. He and his wife, Lynette, have four children. He is also a qualified Provincial B Licence soccer coach (BC) and ARA rowing coach (UK).

Next year's Bible Week will take place from Tuesday 30 August to Friday 2 September. The venue will be announced.

# Rural partnership begins innovative project tackling financial exclusion

Comic Relief is supporting a new initiative by The Arthur Rank Centre, The Plunkett Foundation and The Church of England's Mission and Public Affairs Division to extend access and use of rural credit unions. This innovative project is backed by the Association of British Credit Unions, the Methodist and United Reformed Church, and is likely to see new credit union service points created in rural churches and community buildings nationwide.

Project Consultant, Janet Wilkinson, will be taking the lead on this initiative and working directly with six credit unions across the UK. Janet is the Director of Bristol Credit Union and an experienced project manager with over 15 years' experience in the financial services sector. She will be helping the six credit unions increase their rural membership and develop products suitable for rural people. Her findings will then be shared to enable other groups to establish their own rural service points.

"I'm really excited to be part of this programme," says Janet, "It has the potential to extend the help Credit Unions give to communities and individuals throughout the UK through



collaborative partnerships, spreading the word about local and community based finance".

Many imagine rural life to be idyllic, but over 1.3 million people live in poverty, often hidden within predominately wealthy areas, and financial exclusion is commonplace. The latest official research found that around 200,000 rural residents do not have access to a bank account and only one in eight banks or building societies are present in village communities.

# New Anglican Communion secretary general commissioned

The Most Rev. Josiah Idowu-Fearon was commissioned as secretary general of the Anglican Communion last week in the Chapel of St. Andrew at the Anglican Communion Office in London.

Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby, presided and preached at the commissioning service.

Words of the 100th archbishop of Canterbury, Michael Ramsey, read by the Most Rev. David Chillingworth, Primus of the Scottish Episcopal Church, centred on the task of giving leadership to the mission of the global Anglican Communion in service of reconciliation of Christian disunity: "We are going to devote ourselves to our mission completely, not by viewing Anglicanism as an end in itself, but as a

fragment of the One Holy Catholic Church of Christ."

In his homily, Archbishop Welby pointed out that the two readings for the service – 1 Corinthians 1.26-31 and John 14.15-26 – highlighted the weakness of the person who follows Christ, and, by implication, the weakness of the church, which "carries into its life the reality of the culture and the nature of its members."

But, he added, as the chosen people of God, the people of the Church are "what Christ makes us" and need to return continually to our dependence on Christ.

## Nigerian bishop kidnapped

The Anglican Bishop of Gwagwalada in the Province of Nigeria has been kidnapped and is being held for ransom, according to news reports.

The News Agency of Nigeria and several newspapers are reporting that the captors of the Rt Revd Moses Tabuwaye are demanding 40 million Nigerian Naira (approximately £132,400 GBP or \$202,000 USD) for his release.

"I urge all of you Christians to be very vigilant and security conscious wherever you find yourselves," the Primate of Nigeria, the Most Revd Nicholas Okoh, told worshippers taking part in a pre-pilgrimage retreat on Saturday. "The issue of kidnapping is rampant in the country but we can still curtail the menace if we are vigilant. If we fail to live together as brothers in prayers, we shall perish as fools, so we should endeavour to be our brothers' keepers."

In 2013, Archbishop Ignatius Kattey was kidnapped with his wife Beatrice near their Port Harcourt home in the Niger Delta region; and were released: the archbishop after a week and his wife within a few hours of being taken.
