The Telegraph, Mirror and Metro report that the Bishop of Manchester David Walker and Imam Irfan Chishti, of Manchester Central Mosque, were among religious leaders who joined crowds gathered to express their unity at a multi-faith vigil in St Ann's Square yesterday in the city. The BBC and ITV report that the doors to Birmingham Cathedral were closed yesterday in response to the national terror threat being raised to critical. The BBC quotes the Acting Dean of Birmingham Cathedral, Canon Nigel Hand, as saying the action was taken to put increased security arrangements in place. The building will reopen today. The The Sun reports that armed police lined the streets as the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh arrived for the OBE service at St Paul's Cathedral yesterday. The Dean of St Paul's, David Ison, is quoted. Yorkshire Evening Post reports on increased

security measures at York Minster. ITV reports on a tribute by the Archbishop of York Dr John Sentamu to York residents Angelika and Marcin Klis who were killed as they waited to collect their daughters from the concert. Radio Times reports that Songs of Praise host Aled Jones will visit Manchester Cathedral this weekend for a special edition of the programme scheduled in the aftermath of the attack.
