
# Apology from Archbishop Eamon Martin ahead of Rome summit on abuse

In an effort to deal with the sex scandals rocking the Roman Catholic Church, the Pope has convened an extraordinary summit of bishops in Rome.

This follows his recent, unprompted, admission that priests had exploited nuns as "sex slaves" at a convent in France. Pope Francis decided to call this global conference after discussions with the so-called C9. This is the group of nine cardinal advisers who were appointed soon after Francis was elected.

The Pope is under serious pressure to provide leadership and generate workable solutions to what is the most pressing crisis facing the modern Church.

Stories of abuse have emerged in every corner of the world. And the Church has been accused of covering up crimes committed by priests, leaving its moral authority in tatters. <u>churchnewsireland@gmail.org</u> Page 3



Pope Francis must also confront the assumptions, attitudes and practices that have allowed a culture of abuse to flourish. The extent of this challenge may prove overwhelming.

The Catholic Primate of all Ireland has apologised to victims of clerical abuse. Archbishop Eamon Martin made the comments ahead of travelling to a child safeguarding summit at the Vatican.

He said he had met victims in recent weeks and "heard about how you were hurt and violated and about how your young lives were turned into a nightmare".

# Clontarf Choral Competition judging panel


The judges for this year's Clontarf Choral Competition have been announced. The judging panel will be chaired by the Revd Dr Anne–Marie O'Farrell, renowned composer and harpist. Anne–Marie will be joined on the panel by Bishop Trevor Williams and his wife Joyce.

Anne–Marie has performed all over the world as a solo artist, accompanist and in ensembles, and is regularly broadcast on radio and television. She completed a PhD in composition with Piers Hellawell at Queen's University Belfast and lectures in composition at the TU Conservatory of Music and Drama in Dublin.

Her compositional output includes an extensive body of orchestral, choral, vocal, chamber and instrumental works, and her music is used on examination syllabuses around the world. Her choral works have been performed by

Chamber Choir Ireland, the BBC Singers, Cantique, Trinity Chapel Choir, and Christ Church Cathedral Choir. She is particularly interested in the role of sacred music in concert

Trevor and Joyce both come from Dublin and moved to Belfast when Trevor became a Chaplain at Queens University Belfast. After Queen's, Trevor was a producer with BBC Northern Ireland where one of his responsibilities was to produce Choral Evensong from Irish Cathedrals for BBC Radio 3. Following that, Trevor was Rector of several parishes in Northern Ireland, a Canon of St Patrick's Cathedral Dublin, and leader for 10 years of Corrymeela – an ecumenical community committed to reconciliation in Northern Ireland. He became Bishop of Limerick and Killaloe in 2008 and retired in 2014.

Joyce was born in Clontarf where she lived until she married Trevor and moved to UK. (Her piano teacher was on Castle Avenue.) She enjoys music of all sorts. Her eldest son sings in the choir at St Martin in the Fields in London. Another son is a jazz guitarist in Newcastle on Tyne. A talented singer in her own right, Joyce is currently chairperson of Voices Together Community Choir in Belfast.



Last week as part of the North European Cathedrals Conference 2019 choirs from St Patrick's and Christ Church Cathedrals joined together to sing excerpts from Handel's Messiah, just as they did for the work's premiere in 1741.



## February 21 in Christian history

**February 21, 1109:** Anselm, the Archbishop of Canterbury recognized as the "founder of Scholasticism," dies. One of the most profound thinkers of the Middle Ages, his treatise Why Did God Become Man was the greatest medieval treatise on the atonement. He is also known for his ontological argument for the existence of God.

**February 21, 1142:** Medieval French philosopher, teacher, and theologian Peter Abelard dies. Perhaps best known for his (chaste) love affair with nun Heloise, Abelard made his most important contribution in establishing a critical methodology for theology. Irritated with some of the unreasoning pietism of other monks, he wrote Yes and No, compiling the (sometimes conflicting) sayings of the Bible and church fathers on various controversial subjects.

**February 21, 1173:** Pope Alexander III canonizes Thomas a Becket three years after the Archbishop of Canterbury's martyrdom at the hands of King Henry II's knights.

**February 21, 1431:** Pierre Cauchon, bishop of Beauvais, begins his interrogation of young Joan of Arc. She was eventually condemned as a heretic and burned at the stake.

**February 21, 1801:** John Henry Newman, Anglican leader of the Oxford Movement, is born in London. The movement

sought to reform the Church of England in a "high church" direction, but Newman left the church in 1845 to become a Catholic—a choice he explained in his Apologia pro Vita Sua (1864).

**February 21, 1945:** Eric Liddell, the Scottish Olympian whose story is told in the film Chariots of Fire, dies of a brain tumour. In 1925, he had joined the staff of the Anglo-Chinese Christian College in Tientsin, China (his birthplace). He was captured by the Japanese in 1942 and died just before his scheduled release.

**February 21, 2018:** Billy Graham, the most well-known and effective evangelist of the twentieth century, dies at 99. "America's pastor" preached to millions and saw throngs come to Christ during his evangelistic "crusades" through the United States and across the globe. Graham also advised numerous American presidents and was the driving force behind establishing Evangelicalism as a movement within American Protestant Christianity and beyond.
