10,000 sign petition to stop Fr James Martin speaking at World Meeting of Families

Over 10,000 people have signed a petition to withdraw an invitation to Fr James Martin from the World Meeting Of Families, the Catholic Herald reports.

The petition, started by the Irish branch of Tradition, Family, Property, opposes Fr Martin's attendance on the grounds that he "supports trangenderism for children," and "favours homosexuals kissing during the mass."

Included with the petition is a letter, sent to Dublin Archbishop Diarmuid Martin, criticising Fr Martin's support for the pro-LGBT New Ways Ministry organisation.

In particular, the letter denounces Fr Martin for having "publicly accepted an award from this group, delivered a talk at their event and subsequently developed this talk into a book.

"Fr Martin is also in disagreement with the Catechism of the Catholic Church's reference to homosexual inclination as 'gravely disordered'.

"In this way, he would prevent those with same-sex inclination from arriving at a true understanding of their condition in the light of church teaching and God's mercy. This is a great disservice to those whom he purports to help.

"We believe that sowing error and confusion should have no place at the World Meeting of Families. For this reason, churchnewsireland@gmail.org

we strongly request you to disinvite Fr James Martin from speaking at so important an event."

For his part, Fr Martin insists that he "isn't bothered" by the "ocean of hate and threats," which he has received.

"What kind of Jesuit would I be if I let hatred stop me from loving?" he said. "Besides that, homophobia represents a very small percentage of Catholics, and I have the support of my Jesuit superiors, several cardinals, archbishops and bishops, and, also, the majority of the faithful, many of whom have LGBT people in their families."

"These protesters are not only on the wrong side of history, they're on the wrong side of the Gospel," he added.

The organisers of the World Meeting Of Families event have said there will be no change to the current line-up.

Diminishing priest numbers signal extensive diocesan changes in Clogher

The Diocese of Clogher's diminishing number of priests and their increasing age profile have been highlighted ahead of extensive diocesan changes.

In a pastoral letter announcing the changes, diocesan administrator Monsignor Joseph McGuinness noted that for the 37 parishes and 85 churches in the Diocese of Clogher, which encompasses all of Co Monaghan, most of Fermanagh and portions of Tyrone, Donegal, Louth and Cavan, there are just 58 priests in active ministry.

He said this represented a reduction of about a third in the number of active priests in the diocese in just 20 years.

During the past year alone, the diocese has lost the service of seven priests through death, serious illness and other reasons, and while one new priest was ordained, the letter makes it is clear that the number of active priests in the diocese will continue to decline.

Of the 58 priests who are active in parishes, some 28 of these are over the age of 65, with only seven under the age of 50.

Mgr McGuinness says that "there are obvious implications in this for our ability to sustain the levels of pastoral and sacramental provision which have existed until now, as well as the administrative structures within our diocese".

He calls for more vocations to the priesthood and encourages parents to support a son who shows interest in becoming a priest.

Timetable for Camino de Glendalough 2018 now available

The timetable for the 2018 Diocesan Camino de Glendalough has been announced. The walks will take place on Sunday September 9. The Camino follows the 30 km route along St Kevin's Way from Hollywood in West Wicklow to Glendalough and participants are welcome to undertake the full walk, which takes around six hours, or join the route along the way for shorter pilgrimages.

The day gets underway with a pilgrim blessing during a service of Holy Communion in St Kevin's Church in Hollywood at 9.00 am. Pilgrims undertaking the full route will be sent out from this service. A service of Holy Communion will take place in St John's Church, Laragh, at 9.30 am.

There will be a bus to bring pilgrims planning to walk from the Wicklow Gap to Glendalough or other shorter routes departing from St John's, Laragh, at intervals during the day. Transport will also be available to bring pilgrims back to Hollywood and Laragh after the concluding service which takes place at the Upper Lake in Glendalough at 5.00 pm.

The Camino de Glendalough is one of Celtic Camino routes which can be counted towards the completion of the Camino de Santiago. Those intending to walk the Camino



de Santiago who have Camino passports can get them stamped in St Kevin's Church in Hollywood and at the end of the walk in Glendalough.

The day will conclude with a short service of thanksgiving and prayer at the Upper Lake in Glendalough at 5pm.

The time table for the Camino de Glendalough 2018 is:

9:00 am: St. Kevin's Church, Hollywood – Pilgrims intending to complete the full St. Kevin's Way of 30km will be sent out with a blessing following a short time of prayer and a

service of Holy Communion. Please note that the walk is expected to take approximately six hours.

9:30am: St John's Church, Laragh – Service of Holy Communion

10:30am: Pilgrims planning to walk from either Wicklow Gap or around Glendalough, are invited to make their way to St John's Church, Laragh. A minibus will be on hand to take people to Wicklow Gap. Also, if needed, the minibus will drop people to the Holy City.

11:00 am, 12 midday, 1.00 pm and 2.00 pm: St. John's Church, Laragh – A minibus will take pilgrims to Wicklow Gap, where they will be able to take a two hour walk back to Glendalough along St Kevin's way.

5.00pm: Upper Lake, Glendalough – Pilgrims are invited to gather for an outdoor service of thanksgiving and prayer. A minibus will be available to take pilgrims back to Hollywood after this service.

- * Please feel free to join at any time throughout the day. The key aim is to be at the Upper Lake at 5.00pm.
- * The minibus will be available to transport people from Laragh to Glendalough throughout the day.
