The Day of Pentecost - Whitsunday June 12, 2011

BACKGROUND

For use in Order of Service or Parish Magazine

Like Easter, the Christian festival of Pentecost or Whitsun (which takes place 50 days later), has its origins in a Jewish celebration.

The Apostles were gathered in Jerusalem for the Feast of Pentecost (a day of thanksgiving for the first fruits of the harvest) and to commemorate the receiving of the Ten Commandments by Moses on Mount Sinai (Acts 2:1-4).

And when the feast of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the houses where they were sitting. And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the spirit gave them utterance.

Fired with evangelical zeal, the Apostles sought to spread the 'good news' throughout the world, and the birth of the Christian Church is often said to date from that first Whitsun.

READINGS AND PSALM

Acts 2: 1-21

In Jerusalem, many pilgrims had come for the great Pentecost Harvest Festival. As Jesus had promised, the Holy Spirit of God came upon the gathered company of disciples with great power. They found themselves impelled to proclaim the resurrection Gospel to everyone who would listen.

The Psalm - Psalm 104: 26-36, 37b

1 Corinthians 12 : 3b-13

Paul explains something of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives: he is active everywhere, inspiring different gifts in different people. All should work together in the unity of the church which is now Christ's body on earth.

John 20: 19-23

John's Gospel is unique in speaking of the gift of the Holy Spirit before the events of Pentecost. Here, Jesus appears to his friend sin a locked upper room on the evening of the first Easter; he gives them his peace, a breath of the Spirit and a commission to pronounce forgiveness of sins.

Alleluia. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts I of your faithful, and kindle in us the fire I of your love. Alleluia.

SERMON OUTLINE

Jn 20:19-23 Receive the Holy Spirit

Everything had happened so fast - difficult to make sense of it all... *Early on the 1st day of the week MM had gone to the tomb & saw that the stone had been removed (20.1)*. Then Peter & John had run to the tomb- empty; & then Jesus appeared to Mary in the garden & she *went to the disciples*...

- **1. The Fear of the Jews:-** The disciples had witnessed the hatred & hostility of the authorities so for security *the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for the fear of the Jews.* The future seemed bleak disciples hiding behind locked doors fearful frightened men... Would the authorities come for them? Would they suffer the same fate as Jesus?
- **2. The Figure of Jesus:-** *Jesus came with & stood in their midst..* He had risen indeed further reassured them with
- a) his Presence proof of the Resurrection 1 Cor 15:5,6 he appeared to Peter & then to the 12. After that he appeared to more than 500 of the brothers at the same time, most of whom are still living story could be verified!
- **b) his Peace** v21 *Peace be with you.* Their troubled hearts/minds needed this peace so too do ours/our world!
- 3. The Forgiveness of Sins: he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit...In addition to this wonderful gift Jesus brought pardon, joy, peace, calm & reassurance... He gave them authority to pronounce the forgiveness of sins if you forgive anyone his sins, they are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven. No mere man can forgive sins but it is the church's privilege to convey he message of forgiveness > BCP Absolution:- He pardoneth & absolveth all them that truly repent & unfeignedly believe his holy gospel.
